Triple Elimination Guidelines

- 1. Each team guaranteed to quiz four rounds. See the attached page for the details of the bracketing.
- 2. Individual points for the Top 12 will be based only on the first 4 rounds.
- 3. Seeding for the bracketing on the attached page will be determined by the results of the last quiz and the judgment of district leader. If there are not exactly eight or sixteen teams at the district tournament, first round byes will go to the lowest seeded teams 2.
- 4. The top three teams entering finals in this format will have 0, 1 and 2 losses respectively. In this format the losses carry over into the finals, so the first place team would have to lose 3 times to be eliminated, the second place would have to lose twice to be eliminated and the third place could only lose once before being eliminated.

Rules for the District Top Twelve (See Top Ten Rules from NYI Official Rules book for more details)

- 1. The Top 12 consists of the top 10 individual scorers (excluding the first place team) and the top two scorers from the first place team from the first 4 rounds of District competition on Thursday night. Ties will be broken based on errors and then head to head competition, if available.
- 2. Friday morning the Top 12 quizzing begins following the rounds necessary to complete the team competition.
- 3. The Top 12 quizzers (including members of the first place team) will quiz three rounds. Each round will consist of twenty questions. An individual quizzer quizzes out with 4 correct answers or 3 errors, whichever comes first in a given round. Ten points are deducted from an individual's score for:
 - ♦ both the 2nd and 3rd individual error in a given round
 - ♦ even numbered individual fouls throughout the Top 12.

There will be no bonus questions. One challenge and/or one appeal allowed per question. The first three rounds determine the following based on the average individual scores for these rounds:

- i) the top Washington Pacific quizzer who is the \$100 NNC scholarship recipient and
- ii) the top three Washington Pacific guizzers will be recognized.
- 4. At this point the two members from the first place team will be removed. Three more rounds will be quizzed with the remaining top ten quizzers. The top 5 averages for all 6 rounds will determine the All-star team. Alternates will be determined by that place 6 through 10 during these 6 rounds. Ties will be broken with total errors, then averages from the first four rounds from Thursday night.
